



### Special Education Needs and Disabilities

Lockyer's Middle School has high aspirations for all pupils, including those identified as having Special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND). The governors and staff at Lockyer's Middle School are committed to offering an inclusive curriculum to ensure the best possible progress for all pupils whatever their needs, abilities and learning differences.

We strive to ensure that all pupils achieve their best, that they become confident individuals living fulfilling lives, and make a successful transition into adulthood, whether in employment, further or higher education or training.

For the majority of pupils, their needs will be met by our provision of a well balanced, carefully planned and differentiated curriculum in which skilled and diverse teaching strategies are employed. Some pupils will require some degree of extra support in their learning for varying periods of time, according to their level of need. Lockyer's Middle School recognises that some pupils will need more specialist and targeted support to engage fully in school life and meet their full potential if they are experiencing emotional or mental health difficulties, or have a specific learning difficulty or physical disability. These pupils will be offered a more personalised programme to learning.

Pupils with SEND are included in all areas of our school life wherever possible; including all activities before and after school and every chance is taken for pupils with additional needs and those without to work alongside one another. Discussion with parents/carers always takes place if school staff consider that a pupil cannot take part in an activity due to health and safety reasons.

### The Role of Lockyer's Middle School in Supporting SEND Pupils

- At Lockyer's Middle School we believe that all pupils should make the best possible progress. Where there are barriers to learning, we aim to remove them through a variety of strategies and interventions.
- In consultation with staff, parents/carers and outside agencies we aim to identify all pupils with SEND as quickly as possible so that we can ensure appropriate provision.
- We seek to create an atmosphere of encouragement, acceptance, and respect of achievements and sensitivity to individual needs, in which all pupils can thrive.
- Pupils with SEND will generally be taught alongside their peers in mainstream lessons, with appropriate differentiation and support to enable pupils to access the curriculum. There will be occasions when it will be more beneficial to withdraw the pupil for additional support. Every effort will be made to offer access to the whole curriculum.
- At Lockyer's Middle School we do our best to ensure that pupils with SEND take part in and contribute fully to school life wherever practically possible.
- We work in partnership with parents/carers to support pupils with SEND and ensure that pupils and their parents/carers are involved in the decisions that effect their education.
- We work to promote effective partnerships with outside agencies and feeder schools.

### The Role Parents/Carers have in Supporting their SEND Child

At Lockyer's Middle School we believe that parents/carers are the essential support that pupils need to reach their full potential. Therefore, we encourage parents to speak to staff as regularly as required. As well as engaging in school events parents are involved in their child's education by:

- Attending parent's evenings
- Making effective use of their child's 'Pupil Passport'
- Receiving a written pupil report
- Receiving pupil levels recorded in pupil's homework diaries throughout the academic year
- Contact through the pupil's 'Pupil Passport' and homework diary



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- Invitations to discuss, plan and review future support for those pupils with additional needs.

### The Role of SEND Pupils in their Education

Pupils have opportunities on a daily basis to discuss their feelings, thoughts and any concerns with their form tutors. They also have a Head of Year and a Key Stage Leader to support them if needed. Teaching assistants are assigned to each year group and provide important daily support. Pupils are made aware of the level at which they are working at and where they are expected to be. Pupils with SEND are given the opportunity to review their support and discuss with staff how they feel they need to improve further.

### SEN Support

In accordance with the Code of Practice (*July 2014*), Lockyer's Middle School adopts a 'graduated response' to SEN, which recognises the importance of early identification and a timely, effective response. The Code of Practice describes this response as SEN Support.

### What happens on SEN Support?

When the need for some intervention is identified, teachers will ensure that learning remains accessible through adaptations to their class teaching including:

- Additional differentiation as part of whole class teaching
- Adaptations to planning
- Adapted resources
- Targeted use of TA support
- Changes to pupil grouping

In addition, in some circumstances, a time-limited, appropriately targeted intervention may also be put in place. The intention of this intervention is to:

- Increase rates of progress
- Put pupils back on course to meet or exceed national expectations
- Support whole class lessons, or be built into mainstream lessons as part of guided work

Interventions that take place outside the classroom provide structured one-to-one or small group support, which are monitored and evaluated for impact, and delivered by teachers or appropriately skilled teaching assistants.

If following a period of intervention significant concerns remain about the pupil's progress or development, a discussion will be held with the parents/carers and class/subject teachers. If it is found that the pupil continues work at levels substantially below that expected of children of a similar age, this discussion is likely to result in a decision to involve professionals from outside agencies. These may offer to:

- Support and advise teachers on different approaches.
- Provide more specialist assessments that can inform planning and the measurement of a pupil's progress.
- Give advice on the use of new or specialist strategies or materials.

### Statements/Education Health and Care Plans

Where the school has evidence that any strategy or intervention that has been implemented for the pupil in question has continued for a reasonable period of time without success and that alternatives have been tried, it may be decided to request the local authority to carry out an Education, Health and Care needs assessment. This replaces the statutory Statement of Special Educational Needs from September 2014.
