## 'What Parents & Carers need to know about SnapChat' - Safeguarding information

Snapchat is a photo and video sharing app through which users can chat with friends via text or audio. Images and videos can be shared with specific friends, or as a 'story' (documenting the previous 24 hours) which is visible to a person's entire friend list. Snapchat usage rose significantly during the lockdown periods, with many young people utilising it to stay connected with their peers. The app continues to develop features to engage an even larger audience and emulate current trends, rivalling platforms such as TikTok and Instagram.

In the attached guide, you can find tips on avoiding potential risks such as sexting, visible location and contact from strangers.

Our CREST award students are halfway through their extended experiments in Science Club. They had to choose their own investigation ideas; design the experiment; carry them out safely; and write up their discoveries. The different groups are looking at how shampoo works; investigating pitch using homemade instruments; reaction rates of bath bombs; forensic science techniques and the reaction rates of yeast in bread dough. 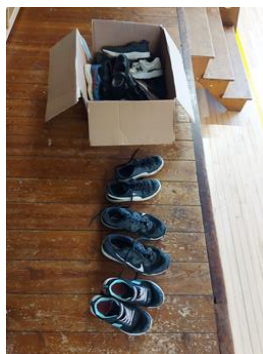

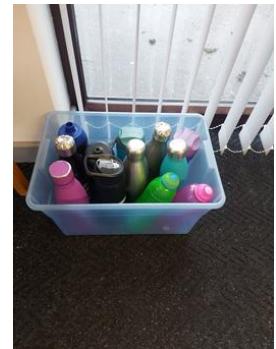
