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Headteacher's Message

Dear Parent/Carers,

As the Autumn Term comes to an end we have so much news to share from around the school. This term has been a real success with pupils working very hard in lessons and taking part in a wide range of opportunities available to them across the school.

Positive Relationships

Mrs McEnnerney has worked alongside our pupils to design new "Gratitude Postcards". These postcards can then be sent to each other to instil positivity and promote kindness to others. The seven winning designs have been made into postcards and all pupils in school have written 1 postcard to someone in our school community who may need a little boost of positivity. We are very proud of their creations and for demonstrating care for others.

Anti Bullying Week

Since Anti-Bullying Week a couple of weeks ago, our children have been involved in a number of activities, to instil and promote the Anti-Bullying ethos in our school and the wider community. These activities have included making and sending gratitude postcards to each other and staff, drawing some AMAZING positivity posters and writing some incredible poems.

Online Safety Day

All pupils will be taking part in an Online Safety Day on the morning of Wednesday 3rd January 2024. We will be running an off-timetable event to consolidate children's awareness of some important issues. Children will take part in this day alongside their tutor group. Themes covered during the day will include:

Year 5 - cyberbullying & safe sharing

Year 6 - the potential dangers of using Social Media

Year 7 - challenging negative online behaviour & staying safe when talking to strangers (including 'grooming')

Year 8 - the risks and legal implications of sending inappropriate images (including 'sexting')

It is our hope that the event will prompt some discussions between yourselves and your children and further improve their safety - and appropriate use - whilst using internet-connected devices at home. Using the internet safely and positively is a key message that we promote at Lockyer's Middle School,



and this is a great opportunity for us to re-emphasise the online safety messages we deliver throughout the year.

Parent Feedback on Report Card 1

Thank you to all those who returned the report card slip confirming you had read and discussed the report with your child. We received a total of 188 responses out of a possible 455, with 80% of the returned slips including a comment. It was wonderful to read such lovely comments made to both your children and the school. These included:

The children watched a performance, followed by a workshop for each class.

There was no charge for this performance, thanks to the generosity of the Friends of Lockyer's, who have funded the full cost.
