Headteacher Update

Good afternoon and welcome to our end of term Newsletter packed full of information and activities our children and young people have been involved in this Spring Term.

Behaviour and Attitudes

At Lockyer's we are incredibly proud of the pro-social behaviour of our children. Good behaviour in school is central to a good education. Children can learn and flourish at Lockyer's in our calm, orderly, safe and supportive environment. Being taught how to behave well and appropriately within the context they are in is vital for all pupils to succeed personally. All children and young people must learn how to act responsibly in the circumstances they find themselves in if they are to succeed on a personal level. We have high standards for the behaviour and conduct of our students, and we adhere to our 'Behaviour Blueprint" which is understood by our staff and pupils, and applied consistently and fairly. Our Blueprint can be found in our Behaviour Guidance document on our website. Report cards and other targeted interventions are sometimes used to help students improve behaviour. All students receive support to help them meet behaviour standards, and where necessary, reasonable adjustments are made for individual students.

The start of the day is important to ensuring your children have a positive day as it sets the tone. Please therefore support your child in ensuring that they arrive fully adhering to our <u>uniform guidance</u> to ensure they can start the day unchallenged - the start of the settling process happens whilst still at home. Please check that your child has the correct clothing and footwear whilst also adhering to our policy regarding makeup and jewellery.

As part of our behaviour expectations, being ready for learning is key. This includes having correct equipment. Starting after Easter, Mrs Ogilvie will be running a stationery shop for students to purchase the required items needed in lessons. The shop will be run on a Wednesday lunchtime from 1:10pm - 1:30pm in the library. The poster below gives an idea of everything students need. We are not running this to make a profit but to make it easier for pupils to replace their stationery. It would be very much appreciated if pupils could bring coins rather than large notes.

The idea was to show students that not only do arson attacks destroy wildlife and adjoining property, they also put others' lives at risk and can result in an arsonist having a criminal record that will stay with them for life.

Arson attacks on heathland are a major problem in Dorset, often in the summer months. With the wind behind them, flames can move quicker than an Olympic sprinter and are very difficult to extinguish. The ferocity of heath fires is such that firefighters can only try and tackle the blaze for 30 minutes at a time.

We are very grateful to the urban Heaths Partnership for coming to talk about this very important local and national issue.

Thank you also to the parents, grandparents and other supporters who came to eat cake, drink tea and watch the prize giving ceremony.



Uniform Expectations 2023 - 2024

A reminder on our uniform expectations as shared with you in the summer term. Parental support is required to ensure that all pupils are well presented. The standard of dress is important because it sets the expectation for work and provides the opportunity for collective pride in our school community as well as a clear structure for students and parents to follow.

| UNIFORM | GUIDANCE NOTES |
|--------------|---|
| Skirts | Grey pleated or flared style skirts (No pencil skirts). Skirts are to be worn without being altered or rolled and should finish just above or on the knee. |
| Trousers | Grey suit-style trousers (No jean type). Trousers should be formal, not fashion in style (eg. skinny or flared). |
| Shorts | Grey tailored, formal schoolwear. |
| Shirt/blouse | White shirt/blouse with a top button. |
| Jumper | Maroon Lockyer's jumper with school logo only. |
| | Should any additional outdoor clothing be required, this must be in the form of a coat or jacket as non-uniform jumpers/hoodies are not permitted . |
| Tie | Lockyer's tie should be knotted at the top button. 7 stripes as a minimum in length. |
| Socks | Plain grey or black knee-length or ankle socks. |
| Tights | Plain grey or black tights. |
| Footwear | Fully black leather/leather-look shoe style, this includes the sole and any logos. Trainers, high heels, slip on shoes, boots and open-toed shoes are not permitted. |

Parents are asked to ensure that school uniform skirts and trousers comply with the above. Where there is any doubt in the suitability of an item of uniform in school, parents are asked to contact the Head of Year before a purchase is made.

Jewellery

- Pupils are permitted to wear one plain stud in each ear lobe only. This must be removed, or taped, if freshly pierced, during PE.
- Pupils may wear a watch.
- Fitbits/fitness trackers may be worn as long they have no messaging or camera facility.
